Within the framework of the operation to audit the floating debt of the State and its dismemberments over the period from 1st January 2000 to 31st December 2019, made public to authorising officers of the State budget since 1st December 2020, repeated several times and widely disseminated to the general public through the media, **the inventory phase of physical files has come to an end.**

In order to allow the serene pursuit of the actual audit work, **an operation to confirm the receivables claimed shall be organised from 17th October to 18th November 2022.** It concerns all the files of receivables received by the Directorate General of Budget and deemed auditable by the Audit firms committed to the effect of appraising the applications thus identified.

To this end, the service providers concerned by these receivables or their representative must imperatively come to the Ministry of Finance, Directorate General of Budget, with the relevant documents to confirm the nature and amounts of the said receivables, **no later than 18 2022 at 3 p.m.**, failing which, the latter will be and declared definitively rejected. The documents required are:

1. a certified copy of the NIC;
2. a copy of the taxpayer card;
3. a copy of the event giving rise to the claim;
4. a copy of the acceptance report or the certificate of work done;
5. the final invoice(s) or payment certificate(s)
6. a copy of the act mandating the person concerned, authenticated before a notary.

The list of service providers concerned, classified in alphabetical order, can be consulted on the website www.minfi.gov.cm or www.dgb.cm.

All the applications definitively rejected at this stage of the operation, can also be consulted on the above websites and the physical files relating thereto will be returned to the administrations and other public entities to which the subjects of the claims are attributed.

The Minister of Finance warns everybody with bad intentions or tempting with fraudulent actions to claim fictitious debts from the State. In this regard, cases of proven falsification of documents have already been apprehended and their perpetrators are currently under arrest.
